





#### **October Devotional**

God's Tables & Bread By: Rose Dessinger

Have you ever considered how God uses tables and bread throughout the bible and how He connects them together? God uses many tables throughout the whole biblical timeline. Tables in the ancient Near East were used for dining & fellowship. They were for sharing meals, a sign

dining & fellowship. They were for sharing meals, a sign of friendship and covenant. While there were no tables mentioned in the Garden of Eden, God would later use furniture—specifically a table—to interact with His creation. Similarly, bread also is used throughout scripture symbolizing provision, covenant, and Jesus Christ himself. It represents God's sustenance for both physical and spiritual needs, the bond between God and his people, and the ultimate sacrifice and gift of salvation offered through Jesus. There are several tables in the Bible:

The Table of Showbread: The very first mention of a table in the Bible comes in Exodus 25. Located in the Holy Place of the Tabernacle, this table held twelve loaves of bread, symbolizing God's continuous provision and covenant with the twelve tribes of Israel. God did not need a tabernacle in which to reside, or a table of bread to eat. He created the building and furnishings as a place for His people to meet with Him and worship Him. God could have chosen any objects for His tabernacle. Using a table communicated to His people about the kind of relationship God wanted them to have with Him. He chose a table—an object of fellowship at which people were used to sitting, eating and talking to one another.

The Passover Table (Exodus 12): While no table was specifically mentioned regarding the Passover Seder, Jewish traditions involve a ceremonial table set with specific symbolic foods and rituals, (including unleavened bread). In this case the table is again an object used in worship.

#### The Lord's Table:

- Matthew 26:20-29 This Passover meal recounts Jesus reclining at the table where he instituted Communion using bread and wine, the communion/unity of believers with Christ, and the New Covenant.
- Luke 22:14-23 emphasizes Jesus' earnest desire to eat the Passover before his suffering and links the meal to the fulfillment of the Kingdom of God.

#### The Wedding Supper of the Lamb:

- Isaiah 25:6 is an Old Testament passage which speaks of a feast for all peoples, with rich food and aged wine. This is interpreted as a picture of the future celebration of God's kingdom and the messianic banquet.
- Matthew 22:1-14: a parable of the wedding feast illustrates the concept of guests being invited to a celebration, with a focus on the importance of being spiritually prepared.
- Luke 14:15: Jesus mentions that the kingdom of God is associated with "eating bread," highlighting the sustenance provided at this divine feast.
- Revelation 19:7-9 describes a future feast in the Kingdom of Heaven, celebrating the eternal fellowship of believers (Jesus's bride) with Christ, who are clothed in the righteousness of the saints, in a glorious union with Christ the Lamb.


