



# **November Devotional** *Is Your Worship Comfortable?*

Read Revelation 3:15-20 By: Rose Dessinger

Let's face it. You've been with Jesus for a while. Maybe even your whole life. You're either working, retired, stay home with the kids or go to school all week. You even make time to rest and have fun. But Sunday... you go to church. While some attend most weeks, others attend only occasionally. Ask yourself why you go to church. Think hard about it and be completely honest with yourself. Is it because your parents told you to when you were growing up? Is it because the bible said so? Because God expects it? Do you fear what will happen if you don't? Do you come to have fellowship with other Christians? Is it just about serving others?

Or is it to worship and fellowship with your Lord and Savior...Your Abba, Christ Jesus and Holy Spirit? Because that's the answer Jesus is looking for. We should want to spend time with Him and to come here to love on Him. That's what praise and worship is. He desires it. Not because HE needs it but because WE need to do it. So we, too, should desire it. Not out of compulsion or fear. Not because mom said so. But for a true desire to thank our Almighty God for all He has done, is still doing and will continue to do...for us, our family, our friends...in us, through us, for us and with us. All because of His amazing love for us.

Yet often we worship Him because He answered our prayer, or life is going good for us. Maybe the music touched you just right and it made you feel good. We confuse that with intimacy. Yes, true worship will cause the deep emotions and even tears while singing praises to God. But real worship doesn't need a mood. It's about the heart posture in you. We say "thank you" to God because "you are who you say you are and because of all you have done for me". With praise

that says, "I love who you are Jesus! Despite the what's going on in my life. Even when everything seems to be falling apart and my faith is barely holding on by a string. Even when it feels like you are far away from me".

True worship doesn't need perfect moments, circumstances or answered prayers. Remember, God knows both our hearts and our motives. He desires hearts that surrender to Him. Willing hearts that get vulnerable with him. Pure hearts that desire true change and are willing to give him everything just to make that happen. Authentic hearts that will worship in the dark, in the silence, and when no one is looking. And yes, even hearts that cry out when nothing changes. Praiseful hearts. Not because we feel like it but because he is still worthy. Praise that happens even through the anxiety, the worry, fears and tears. Even when you're disappointed when his answer is no or silent. That's when it's real.

But all too often we let our hearts for Jesus grow complacent and lukewarm. We become too comfortable singing without considering the words. We listen to sermons without going home and let them change our minds and hearts. We want healing or deliverance from sin without doing any of the work. Jesus says He will "spit out" the lukewarm because their spiritual indifference is more offensive to Him than outright rejection. Jesus' strong statement serves as a call to repentance, urging followers to commit fully to Him rather than remain in a state of spiritual apathy, compromise and inaction.

The truth is...Jesus isn't interested in making you comfortable. Change is uncomfortable and sometimes it hurts. Because that means letting the Holy Spirit work on changing the sin in your life. That's true worship. So I ask you...Still feeling comfortable? Has your fire for Jesus been going out? God has a plan for that. Just trust Him with it.

Wish List: The Food Challenge was very successful as our congregation donated many items since February.


Thank you for your generosity! We are changing the title to Wish List as there are things other than food that are needed for families and use at the day center.

For various reasons, we have spent almost \$20k more than we have received through September 30, 2025.

- 1. While we are keeping expenses down as much as possible, prices are going up. We have spent \$9,239 more in 2025 compared to 2024.
- 2. Donations are also down this year compared to 2024: \$7,480. \$ received through rent & interest: down \$3,019.


